Dick Maurer passed away in October, 2021. Dick was buried in the Fort Logan National Cemetery in Denver, CO. He was 77 years old. Dick began his professional life serving his country in the Navy. He became an airline pilot with Holiday Airlines in 1972 then served as an F.B.I. Special Agent 1972-1978. Dick was hired by Braniff in 1978, but was caught up in the furlough just 2 years later. He was hired by one of the upstart airlines, Frontier Horizon in 1983 then went onto Continental Airlines. After his airline retirement in 2004, Dick was employed in the delivery of commercial trucks. He was living in Denver, CO.
