ARECA member Sandra Glau has advised us that her brother-in-law, ARECA member Robert Glau, passed away peacefully in his sleep on July 29, 2022, just prior to his 92nd birthday.

Bob was born in Angora, Nebraska to Jessie and Wilhelmina Glau on August 16, 1931. He attended high school in Alliance, Nebraska and graduated in 1949.

He worked as a pilot for Continental Airlines for 41 years, having been hired at 19 years of age in 1951. Because of mandatory FAA regulations he retired at age 60. During his impressive career Bob had the pleasure of flying many aircraft models. The aircraft he flew included the DC-3, DC-6 and 7, Convair 240/34, Vickers Viscount, DC-9, DC-10, Boeing 707, 720, 727 and the 747. He flew both domestic as well as Pacific and Atlantic routes and was based in ELP, DEN, LAX and HNL.

Bob married the love of his life, former Continental flight attendant Joyce Cochran on January 16, 1953 in El Paso, Texas and the couple enjoyed almost 70 years together.

After his retirement Bob was an ardent golfer and entrepreneur. He enjoyed farming in Nebraska, playing basketball with other seniors and recreational flying.

He is survived by his wife, Joyce, sons Robert, Dean and Rocky Glau, daughter Amber Fudenberg and four grandchildren.
