



The following notice regarding the passing of former Continental pilot Dale Haas was provided by Golden Eagles member Herb Jellander. This information has been previously posted as a notice to our members but that notice did not contain the details of the memorial service for Dale. Herb has provided that information at the end of the notice below.

Dale Raymond Haas and his family have been our close friends for 40 years so it is with heavy heart that we notify you of his passing. Dale passed away April 5, 2017 in Gig Harbor, Washington, just short of his 82nd birthday. Dale joined the Marine Corps at age 17 during the Korean War and served three years, primarily as a Radio-Telegraphic Operator. Again a civilian, he took his first flying lesson in an Aeronca Champion airplane in 1958 and went on to a career of more than 50 years of flying time. After gaining experience as a crop duster, he joined Western Airlines, flying international routes. From there, he went to Continental Airlines and flew for them for over 20 years. He moved on to America West airlines from which he formally retired in 1995. In "retirement", Dale moved to Gig Harbor, Washington where he became Captain for Orca Bay Aviation, flying the Vancouver Grizzlies and Vancouver Canucks to their many games.

Interment will be private, but all are invited to the Celebration of Life to be held at the Thousand Oaks Elks Lodge at 158 N. Conejo School Road in Thousand Oaks, CA on Saturday, July 1, 2017 from 3:00 to 6:00 pm.
