





A LAST WORD:





Enclosed is the negative of the picture we were talking about in Las Vegas. The picture was taken at Chicago O'Hare in May of 1961. Freddy, Hal and Dean had just flown in on a turn and were on their way back to LAX. I was on my way to PHX. It was just one year later, in May of 1962 that Freddy, Ed Sullivan and Dean Allen perished on Flight #11 over Missouri.

Hal Ross had transferred to ELP to fly Captain on the Viscount, or he would have been the Co-pilot.

Do you still have a copy of the poem which appeared in the Denver Post after the tragedy?

I don't have a picture of Eddie Sullivan--he was a helluva pilot, but not much on publicity.



Who taught the work


