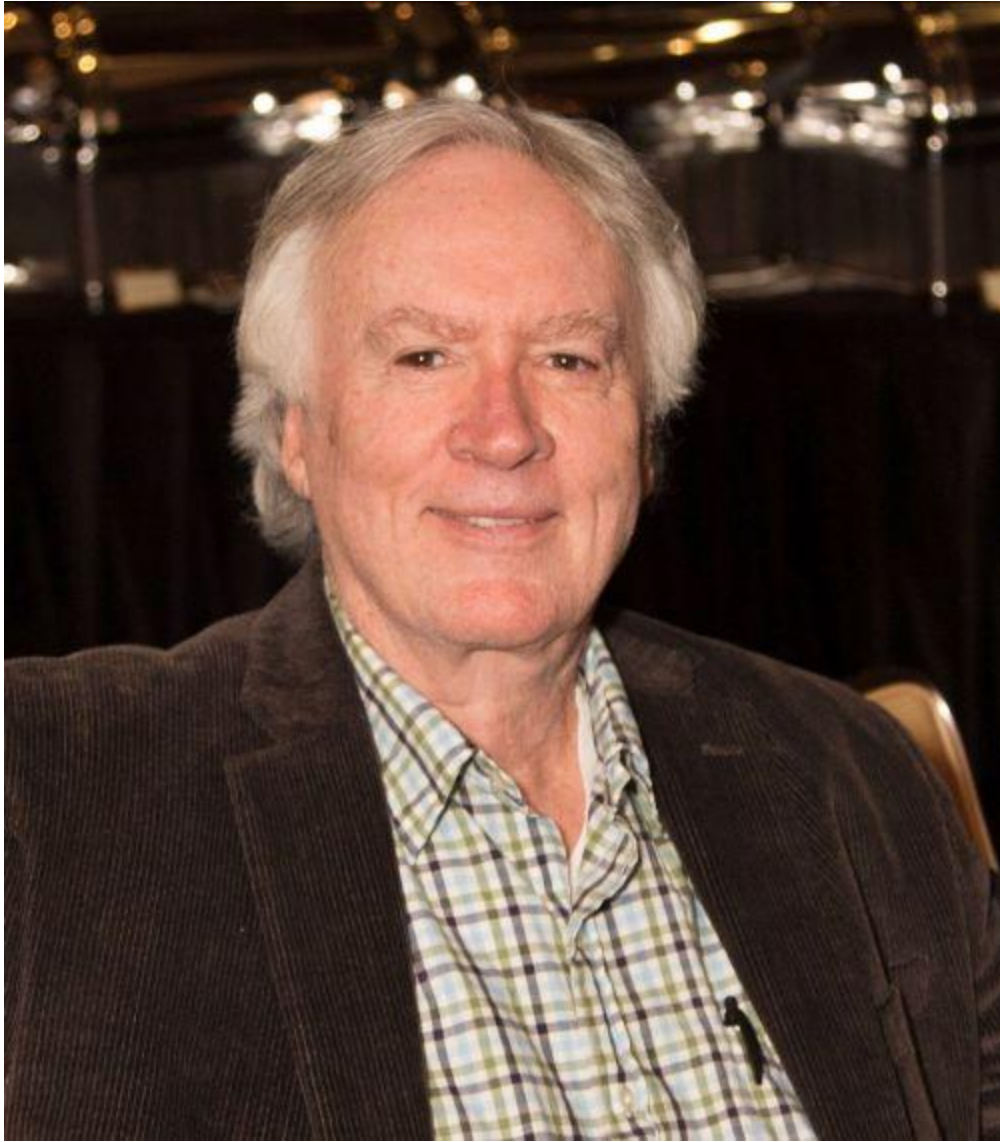

He made his transition peacefully early Wednesday morning on the 12th of June. Ralph was diagnosed with a mutation of cancer called Exon 20 over 2 years ago and fought it valiantly through chemotherapy and two clinical trials. A wonderful brother, brother-in-law, stepfather, terrific uncle and faithful friend, he loved his family and friends unconditionally. He joined Continental Airlines on May 14, 1984 and eventually had to retire in 2006 because of a medical condition in his hands called Dupuytrends. Honoring his request, he was cremated and
